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Mad Greens Wants CSU To Swap Waffles For Soup, Salads

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Denver-based [Mad Greens](#) is hoping that Colorado State University students are ready to put down the waffles and start eating healthy.

Mad Property LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of Mad Greens, has taken over the former Waffle House location at 616 S. College Ave. in Fort Collins and plans to open one of the soup, salad and panini restaurants in March.

"Mad Greens is a great dining option for students and neighbors," said Nick Christensen, president of Chrisland Commercial Real Estate, who brokered the \$675,000 deal for the Waffle House property, in a statement.

The new location is the company's first building purchase in its five-year history.

This will be the second Mad Greens in Fort Collins; the first opening in 2007 at 2120 E. Harmony Road.

"Fort Collins has embraced our Harmony Road location," said Marley Hodgson, CEO of Mad Greens, said in a statement. "We jumped at the chance to open a new location and invest in this great community."

Mad Greens has eight restaurants in Denver, Boulder and Fort Collins and plans to add two to three additional locations in the next 14 months.
